1) Walking guru Dr Rodney Tolley visit – 19-20 November 2009

As a Director of Walk21, Dr Tolley has a unique oversight of developing practice in walking in the UK, North America, Europe and across the world. He has conducted hundreds of workshops, walkabouts and masterclasses in communities across the world, including over 50 cities in Australasia. His focus is primarily on walkability, accessibility, wayfinding and pedestrian amenity in public spaces, streets and arterial roads.

Dr Tolley has been nominated as a world sustainable transport 'hero', being "the extraordinary creative people who

over the last decades have led the way in the uphill fight to sustainable transportation, sustainable cities and sustainable lives.”

The Heart Foundation has brought Rod to Adelaide to share his knowledge and experience, and is offering the following free events:

- **Public Presentation** (Thurs 19 Nov, 9:00am – 11:30am; Sebel Playford Adelaide, 120 North Tce)

A presentation on the importance of walking and the current status of walking policy thinking in cities in around the world. Dr Tolley will cite emerging best practice in providing environments where people choose to walk and to walk more often.

2) Public bike scheme news

- **Melbourne:** Car club RACV, in conjunction with Alta Bicycle Share from the USA, has been awarded the contract to design and operate Melbourne’s public bike system. The system will use the Bixi bike share system used in Montreal since May 2009, and will be on the streets mid-2010ish. The RACV’s involvement is part of transforming from being car-focused to mobility-focused, including advocating for the rights of bike riders.

Under the scheme, users will buy a daily (\$2.50), weekly, monthly or yearly (\$50) subscription for use. The first 30 min is free, with the cost then increasing with usage time in a price structure aimed at short trip use rather than competing with tourist bike hire. Helmets are still to be sorted.

- **Copenhagen:** one of the first cities to have a shared bike scheme wants to augment its reputation for bike transport leadership through a design competition for the most modern public bike system in the world – to help meet a target of 50% of all work commuting by bike by 2015.

Among the criteria are high visibility, user-friendliness (notably booking and payment), strengthening sustainable mobility, and interacting with the city’s architectural expression. Technically, the system must be better than previous generations, with quality riding characteristics.

- **Paris:** Statistics for the last 2 years of Paris’ Velib system indicate that almost 80% of the 50 million trips taken on the system have been to access public transport. 3) National Bike Paths Projects funding

The Federal Government has announced funding for 170 new cycling projects across Australia as part of its \$40 million National Bike Paths Projects fund, including:

- \$2.2 million in **Tasmania** for 6 cycling infrastructure projects
- \$5.4 million in **Sydney** for 22 projects in 15 local government areas
- \$3 million in 35 projects in **South Australia**
- \$2.8 million in 16 projects in **Western Australia**
- \$1.2 million for cycleways in **Canberra**
- \$4.4 million for **Melbourne**
- \$5.4 million for the **Illawarra and South Coast**
- Nearly \$1 million for a shared path at **Hervey Bay** and over \$900,000 for **Coffs Harbour**.

4) Round 2 applications for the Regional and Local Community Infrastructure Program

The Federal Government has opened Round 2 of the RLCIP, with

- \$100 million to be shared between all councils and shires, based upon a submission of eligible projects. Submissions close on 20 November 2009;
- \$120 million for larger Strategic Projects allocated on a competitive basis. Applications close 15 January 2010.

The threshold for larger Strategic Projects has been reduced to a minimum of \$1 million. Projects supported under the RLCIP have included sports grounds, disability access, walkways and environmental improvements. See

9) Australian Cycling Conference 2010 – registrations open

The 2010 Australian Cycling Conference will be held on 18 and 19 January, with a parallel session on Day 2 to accommodate the large number of high-quality abstracts submitted from around Australia and overseas. Program highlights include:

- Guest speaker *Ms Ineke Spapé*, an urban and traffic planner from The Netherlands. Ineke is an I-ce international cycling expert, member of the Dutch Transport Safety Board, Associate Professor at the NHTV Breda University of Applied Sciences (where she lectures in Mobility and Urban Planning) and a consultant in mobility and space with Dutch consulting firm SOAB consultants. She is also familiar with the Australian context and how the Dutch experience can be

related to this.

10) A peek around the country...

- West Australia's **pedestrian death toll** is likely to hit a five-year high. See <http://www.news.com.au/perthnow/story/0,,26159612-2761,00.html>. [*Interestingly, the quotes used focus the contribution made to the crashes by pedestrians – Ed*]
- Brisbane cyclists are set to benefit from the \$8 million **RBWH Cycle Centre**, which will be open to the public from October 2009 and features 750 bike parking spaces, male and female shower facilities, lockers, ironing facilities, clothes drying rooms, hair dryers, and a towel service. - A travel plan for a **Victorian primary school** has raised the option of keeping cars outside a 2km radius of the school and for students to walk or ride the rest of the way. - The **Smith Family** is facilitating an innovative program to promote exercise, healthy eating and active lifestyles in 13 schools **around Australia**. The program, funded by the Dept of Health and Ageing, is working with 13 local communities and schools to teach students about bicycle riding, road safety and bike maintenance as well as nutrition and other aspects of healthy lifestyles. - The **City of Canada Bay**, NSW, has won the Keep Australia Beautiful, Sustainable Cities Award. The Award recognises Council's proactive and innovative approach to sustainability and engaging individuals, community groups, business and schools in a range of environmental projects and initiatives. Under its **walk/shop/wheel program**, Council gave wheelie bags (over 830 in total) to people who committed to walking or riding to local shops (and spent \$50 at a local business).

- A \$1.9 million Brisbane City Council project, which will provide 300m of 3m-wide path between New Farm Park and Cutters Landing, will **complete a 'missing link'** in Brisbane's river walk by February next year. 12) European industry news

- The **Paris Council** has voted to extend a subsidy on e-Scooters to e-Bikes, for mobility, public health, air pollution and noise reasons. The subsidy is for up to 25% of the price, up to € 400.
- Under the 2nd **Ecolncentive Bike Promotion** by the Italian Ministry of Environment, 2,000 bikes sold within 2 hours under the bike buying incentive scheme, with the budget of € 7.6 million spent on 57,000 bicycles after 5 days. The Ministry hopes to repeat the scheme in 2010.
- For the first time, e(lectric)-bikes have **outsold city bikes** – usually the largest market segment – in The Netherlands.
- **Ming Cycles** in Taiwan is gearing up for a world-wide boom in e-bikes with a new assembly hall dedicated to e-bikes, expected to be running in March 2010. The 2010 production total is expected to be 10,000 e-bikes, which retailing at

about €2,000.

- The GFC has affected the **bike market** differently across the world. E.g. Spain, Canada and Slovenia have had good years; Portugal, Russia and Italy have been hit hard; Germany, Poland and the USA have also been hit, but perhaps not as hard. Generally, exports and imports have had different fates, and the low end market has suffered the most, while e-bikes are increasing in popularity.

- BH's **e-Motion** has won an e-bike race up (in)famous Alpe d'Huez. The pedal assist bike finished in just over 37 minutes, with 30% of its battery power left.
